FOR THE WAR AIMS COURSE

MODERN AND CONTEMPORARY EUROPEAN HISTORY 756 pages \$3.00

By J. Salwyn Schapiro, Ph. D. Associate Professor of History,
College of the city of New York.

This is the most recently published textbook on 19th century European history. It gives a well balanced treatment of the various aspects of 19th century European history, political, military, social, economic, and cultural.

Particular attention is given to the causes and conduct of the war. There are chapters on International Relations, 1870-1914, and The World War. This last chapter brings the war down to June, 1918. The book is especially adapted to cover the immediate events leading up to the outbreak of the war in 1914, the progress of the war and the occasion of our entrance into it, as well as the remoter causes shown by the economic and political history of Europe during the 19th century.

A book of speeches and essays by leading American statesmen and men of letters with a special section on Foreign Opinion of the United States. This book was used last year in college courses in English Composition, and History where teachers wanted to give special attention to American Ideals.

Nine speeches by President Wilson and seven speeches by other American leaders setting forth the ideals of this country, the causes of the war, and the aims of the United States in fighting for liberty, peace, and justice. The instructors in charge the Course on War Aims prescribed by the War Department to be given to all men in the Students Army Training Corps will need a text to place in the hands of students and also to guide the organization of material by the instructing force. The only work now published which meets this need is "Collected Materials for the Study of the War" compiled by Professor Albert E. Mc Kinley of the University of Pennsylvania, editor of The History Teacher's Magazine.

The collection contains two excellent syllabi for the study of the War and its antecedents, President Wilson's principal War addresses, a treatment of the Geography of the War with 21 maps, the most important United States statutes and executive proclamations bearing upon the War, and a critical bibliography of war books.
