Dialects of Moose Factory and Fr Albany are quite alike. Some words different but no difference in grammar. Only phonetic change is from Albany N to Moose L. Here at Albany, Protestants use La great deal (due apparently to intermarriage with Moose Indians and to use of Anglican prayer books - all in Moose dialect - J M C). The Albany Indians travel a good deal in winter with their dogs to Moose Factory. The Catholic Indians here at Albany, about 30 families, all use N. not L. (Apparently they all married more to the North, where N is exclusive, and all Catholic prayer books are in the old Albany L dialect).
